Elementary GIFTS Lessons

As a culmination of their classroom guidance experiences from kindergarten on, the fifth grade students will be spending the remaining of the year working on character trait reports. They will have the opportunity to choose any of the traits that we have focused on in our classroom lessons. In their reports, they will define the trait and explain why it is important. They will also need to communicate examples of how a fifth grader might demonstrate the trait and relate it to a career in which it would be important. Students will identify someone they know personally who exhibits that trait and find three pictures to include in their report that illustrate it. Reports will be given during the last three classes of the school year.





Forgiveness will be defined as: to stop blaming or feeling angry toward yourself and others. We will identify personal experiences in which we or our peers have demonstrated forgiveness. We will explore how forgiveness can be an important element in conflict resolution.

Discovery Days at Mid-State Technical College






The 2013-14 Almond-E in the conference (16-2) team as they finished th finished his career as th

ASSIGNMENT OF STUDENTS TO CLASSES 2014-15 SCHOOL YEAR

Parents who wish to request a specific teacher for their child who will enter grades kindergarten through fifth during the 2014-2015 school year must do so no later than May 1, 2014. This deadline was developed to give the teachers and principal sufficient time to assign students to classes prior to the end of the school year. At the completion of this process, your child's teacher for the 2014-2015 school year will be indicated on your child's fourth quarter report card. The Board policy regarding the assignment of students to classes includes the following: "Students may be assigned to other classrooms upon parent written request provided that: a) Space permits, b). reasons are appropriate, c). the request is received on or before May 1st of the previous school year." Requests must include an appropriate reason for desiring a particular class or teacher. Reasons for request that are vague may be returned for further clarification. Request forms are available in the office. Just because a request is submitted does not mean that the student will automatically be placed in the requested classroom.
