### "If we teach today as we taught yesterday, we rob our children of tomorrow."

John Dewey

The above statement is truer today than any other time. Our district finds itself in need of technology upgrades. Therefore, we will be asking our taxpayers to approve a non-recurring referendum on April 2, 2013 for the sole purpose of updating technology in our district. The resolution will read as follows:

#### REFERENDUM TO EXCEED STATE REVENUE LIMITS ON A NON-RECURRING BASIS ALMOND-BANCROFT PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT

Shall the Almond-Bancroft Public School District be authorized to exceed state revenue limits on a non-recurring basis by \$75,000.00 for the 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-17, and 2017-18 school years to update, maintain, and supplement School District technology?

We understand this is a difficult time to ask community for financial support. However, we cannot put off the education for our students and their futures. It is very important to understand that **none of the money** will be used for salaries/benefits, maintenance, or the operation of the school. All money will be used to enhance our technology program.

### What is the need for the technology referendum?

- Keeping phone system/networks up to date as to allow quality communications with parents/ community.
- Access to courses/opportunities otherwise not available in smaller school districts.
- Ability to connect with resources around the world instantly.
- Having computers that have the ability to support/run the state mandated Smarter Balanced Assessment program.
- Provide our staff with the tools necessary to provide the very best education for our students.
- Provide skills and resources for our students that will be needed in most jobs in and out of technology in the 21st century.
- Increase the learning opportunities beyond the walls of the traditional classroom or school day.

### **Questions regarding Referendum:**

1. Is it possible to spend any of the \$375,000.00 raised in the referendum during the next 5years for other purposes in addition to technology?

No. The ballot question asks the residents of the Almond-Bancroft School District to approve an increase in their district's revenue limit for technology purposes only. By law, we can only use the approved funds for the stated purposes included in the ballot.

2. What do you mean by the term technology – just computers?

The district's technology plan includes equipment well beyond computers. We are using the term technology to mean software, hardware, infrastructure, including emerging technology such as hand held devices, etc.

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The Almond-Bancroft School District, with support of families and community members, will provide a safe and supportive learning environment, which challenges and prepares each student for success today and tomorrow.

#### 3. What would approval of the referendum mean?

Approval of the Technology referendum allows the district to:

- Maintain existing levels of technology
- Upgrade and expand our core network infrastructure
- Upgrade technology security
- · Increase wireless coverage for greater accessibility for student and community members

### 4. Why haven't the technology projects been addressed as part of the district's regular operating budget?

Although the district budgets for annual technology projects, our current technological needs exceed the annual budget. On an average the district spends approximately \$58,000.00 on its technology program per year. School districts in Wisconsin are limited in their annual operational budgets by the state revenue limit calculation. Because of this, adding funds to our technology budget directly affects the funds we have available for other areas of student instruction and operations. Therefore, the Almond-Bancroft School District is seeking alternate funding to address these technological needs.

### 5. What would it mean if the referendum does not pass?

If the referendum does not pass there would be a delay in the effective implementation of current technology into the classroom.

### 6. Will teachers receive training on new technology? How will it be funded?

Yes, training is critical to the appropriate use of technology in the classroom. The Almond-Bancroft School District is committed to training its professional educators and will continue to use the general operating budget to fund technology training.

### 7. What will be the increase on my taxes if this levy is approved?

Annual mill rate impact for \$75,000 for 5 years is shown using the graph below. Local taxpayers will likely see an average annual increase of approximately \$0.33 per \$1,000 of appraised value of their home.

### From the Desk of the School Nurse: Lynn Bergman R.N., BSN

This is the time of year that respiratory viruses can peak in our community. These viruses may cause the Common Cold, Influenza, RSV, Croup, and Pneumonia. Viruses are easily spread from person to person from respiratory secretions through close contact with infected persons or contact with contaminated surfaces or objects. Infection can occur when infectious material contact mucous membranes of the eyes, mouth, or nose and by breathing in droplets generated by a sneeze or cough. Here are some helpful practices to follow and to teach your children in helping reduce the spread of germs at school and at home.

- Do not share drinking cups, straws, eating utensils or food
- Frequently wash your hands with soap and water, scrubbing for 15-20 seconds
- Clean commonly touched surfaces frequently with disinfectant spray or wipes (handles, phones, door knobs, stair railings
- Cough into sleeves Kleenex or Napkin
- Vaccinate your family with the Flu Shot annually
- If your child becomes ill, please do not send them to school

The following are guidelines to follow when deciding whether or not to send your child to school.

- If your child has a fever of 100 degrees or higher, the child should stay home for 24 hours after the temperature returns to normal (without fever reducing medications)
- If your child has vomited or had diarrhea, the child should stay home until 24 hours after the last episode
- If your child has any rash that may be disease related or you do not know the cause, check with your family physician before sending your child to school, especially if there is a fever with the rash.
- If your child is diagnosed with strep throat, they should stay home unit they have received 24 hours of the antibiotic.
- If your child is ill, please call the school and report the illness.

Please do your part in keeping our community healthy. Thank you in advance for helping to reduce the spread of illness.




