





Hunter Safety Class Offered

The Almond Rod and Gun Club will sponsor a hunter safety education class for area youth and adults.

Classes will be held in the Almond-Bancroft High School auditorium. The class will be held on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays.

Registration for the class will be on Thursday April 30th at 7:00 PM in the auditorium. Students under the age of 18 must have a parent or legal guardian present to register for class. The cost of the class is \$10.00 per student. Students are required to have a DNR customer ID number before graduating from the class. It is best if students have their ID number before registration.
