District Administrator Message



Fall is my favorite time of year. I love when the sun is shining, but the air is cool. It is also the most beautiful time of year - especially in Wisconsin, with all of the trees turning colors. I recently looked online to see what we should be celebrating in the month of October, and I was pleasantly surprised with some of the things that should be recognized in the month of October.

First of all, October is National Book Month and National Learning and Development month. In my short time in Almond-Bancroft, I am so impressed with the focus on learning and development that our staff, school board and community have. We are setting high expectations for our students and putting supports into place so that all of our students can meet these expectations.

At our elementary school, we have a Title 1 teacher and an interventionist that work with our struggling learners in both reading and math. This year we were also able to hire an interventionist at our middle school who is not only working with our struggling learners in reading and math but also our advanced learners in math. We are implementing a new phonics curriculum in K-2 that will help build an even stronger foundation for our students. At all levels we are analyzing many pieces of data (academic, social-emotional, behavioral) to better understand the needs of our students, and teachers and administrators are collaborating to develop ways to support them.

Books have always been a large part of my life. As a former English teacher, I love the way that books can take us places that we have never been and can give us experiences that we could never have on our own. It has been difficult in the last couple of years with Covid to really be able to enjoy books to the same extent that we have in the past, especially at school. However, this year we have been able to open up our library for more classes to come in and enjoy finding their 'best fit' book. Mr. Collins, our former librarian and current ELA teacher, and Mrs. Mocker, our new librarian, have purchased new books for both elementary and secondary students that will appeal to all tastes. Please encourage your children to pick up a book when they have some down time - there is nothing else like it!

I was also very excited to see that October is national caramel, cookie and dessert month! I usually feel a little guilty when I indulge in these three things, but this month I don't have to! This will just give me a reason to treat the staff who work each day to bring out the best in each and every student regardless of the other stresses going on. Covid is one of the things that adds some stress to everyone's life. We have been fortunate so far that we have not had many students or staff out for Covid or for quarantines. I hope that this will continue as we move through fall and into winter.

In this month's newsletter, you will find pictures and highlights from Homecoming, our proposed budget and notice of our annual meeting, information on our Covid testing program, and acknowledgement of our athletic teams.

Thank you for your continued support of our schools, teachers and students. Please feel free to reach out with any questions, concerns, suggestions or just to chat about what is going on in the district. I look forward to hearing from you!

COVID-19 SCHOOL TESTING: FAQS FOR PARENTS

This week we have the ability to test students, staff and immediate family members for Covid at our school. We hope that having testing in our building will provide a convenient option for parents, students and staff who would like to get tested. We want to reiterate that there are no requirements for getting tested and we will never test a student without parent permission. We just want our families and staff to know that this is an option for them should they so choose. We have put together some Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about the testing that are included here. Please feel free to reach out to Jodi Becker, District Administrator, or Toni Schumacher, 4K-12 Principal, if you have any questions.

General Information

Why is our school testing for COVID-19?

First and foremost, our community does not have a close place for students to get tested. Many parents and students are having difficulty setting appointments for testing. Because the testing clinics are not close, parents are taking off work to get their child tested. A clinic in the school will be more convenient for families in both of these situations. School testing is also another layer of protection for students, teachers, and school staff. Testing is a safe, effective way to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and help keep our schools open for in-person learning. This is especially important for children under 12 years old who are not yet able to get vaccinated against COVID-19, families and staff with younger children at home, and others who are not vaccinated or are otherwise at risk for getting seriously sick from COVID-19. Because of the fact that many of the symptoms of COVID are similar to those of other ailments, having testing in our schools enables us to test students who are feeling ill but may not have COVID. This may allow students to get back into their classrooms sooner, without having to be quarantined.

What is the COVID-19 Testing Program at Almond-Bancroft?

Almond-Bancroft's COVID-19 Testing Program offers free testing to students and staff for COVID-19. At a parent's request, we will be testing students that have symptoms of COVID or if they have been deemed a close contact of a positive case. Parents can also request that their child be tested on a more regular basis.

Who is able to get tested?

Students, staff and their immediate family members are able to get tested at the school-based clinic.

If parents would like to get tested, will they be allowed in the school to test?

Yes, immediate family members of students and staff who want to get tested are able to. The testing clinic is in room 103. This room is located across from the main door, so exposure to students is extremely unlikely.

On the DHS website, there are other types of testing available to schools including regular testing of all students and testing for students in activities. Will we have to do that kind of testing if we are part of this program? The school chooses the model and services that are appropriate for their community. The DHS (Department of Human Services) or the DPI (Department of Public Instruction) are not mandating a certain type of testing be conducted at a school.

Did the school district receive any incentive to participate in the program?

No, there was no incentive provided by any state or federal organization to participate in the program.

Will my child be tested without my knowledge?

No, students will never be tested unless a parent is contacted and gives permission first or if the parent contacts the school to ask for their child to be tested. With our current protocol, if a child comes down to the office because they are feeling ill, a member of our staff takes their temperature. If they have a fever and/or are ill, our staff contacts the parent to come and pick up the child. The only addition to our current protocol is now the parent will also be reminded of our on-site clinic and they can give permission for their child to be tested or not.

Does my child have to get tested to take part in school sports and extracurricular activities?

No, COVID-19 tests are optional even if participating in an activity.

How will the school protect my child's privacy?

Testing results will be shared only for public health purposes, which may include notifying close contacts that they may have been exposed to COVID-19 and taking other steps to prevent the further spread of COVID-19 in your school community. Information sharing and notifying of contacts will be done in a way that protects your child's privacy. Sharing of information about your child will only be done in accordance with applicable law and policies protecting student privacy and the security of your child's data.

How do I opt out of this program?

Because the test is only given upon specific request by the parent, no opt out option is necessary.

How the program works

How do I give consent for my child to be tested?

A one-time consent form will allow students and staff to participate in testing program. This form was mailed to each student's home. If you would like your student to be able to participate in the testing program, please return the consent form to the school office. If the form is not returned, a verbal consent may be given. **Either way, before a student is tested at the clinic, parents will be called to get permission for the test that day.**

Is the one-time consent form all that is needed?

No, anyone who is tested must register on the Covid Connect portal to enable our testing vendor to conduct the test. Once parents register their child for the test, they will receive a QR code that the vender uses to conduct the test. School staff will explain the process to parents as needed.

To register your child for the COVID-19 Testing Program, visit register.covidconnect.wi.gov

When will my child be tested?

As per our current protocol, if your child becomes ill at school and/or has a fever, school staff will call parents to come and pick up their child and let them know that there is testing available if they would like their child tested. If their child is deemed a close contact to a positive case, school staff will call parents to come pick up their child and will let them know of the testing option. Students will only be tested if their parents would like them tested. Parents can also request a test for their student at any time.

What happens if I choose not to give consent for my child to be tested?

This is a parent's choice. Current protocols for ill students and close contacts will be followed.

Can my child's teacher send him/her down for testing?

No, teachers will never send a child for testing. Teachers would follow the protocols already in place for sending ill students down to the office for parents to be contacted. When the parent is contacted, they can then give consent for their child to be tested, if they desire.

How will the testing be done?

The COVID-19 tests will be free, quick, and easy. We will use a viral test, known as an antigen (rapid) test, which returns a result in approximately 30 minutes and a PCR test that will take approximately 24-48 hours to get results.

How is the test given?

Both tests involve a nasal swab. It is a quick and easy test. This nasal test gently swabs the inner part of the lower nostril. The test is not painful. We do not use the longer swabs that reach higher into the nose.

Who will conduct the test?

Our vendor, Covid Clinic, will conduct the COVID-19 testing.

How much does the test cost?

The COVID-19 tests will be free to students and staff. You will never receive a bill, and your insurance will not be charged.

Results

When will we know the results of the test?

The results of the rapid test should be available within 30 minutes. The results of the other test will be available within 24-48 hours.

Is the test reliable?

Tests can show a false negative or false positive, but most test results are useful and give families the information they need. Sometimes—depending on the type of test and other factors—more testing to confirm a result may be recommended. This is the reason that we are utilizing both tests – the Rapid test and the PCR test – to ensure that we have the best information.

What if my child tests positive?

You will need to keep your child home for the quarantine time that Portage County dictates. You will be asked to provide information about your child's close contacts so that everyone who has been exposed can be notified. We will be in touch to discuss medical care and other support for your child and family. We are following the recommendations of the Portage County Health Department.

What if someone in my child's school tests positive?

If your child was determined to be a close contact with that person, we will be in touch to discuss what actions to take. We are following the recommendations of the Portage County Health Department.

Current Portage County guidelines for close contacts:

A vaccinated individual who does not have symptoms does not have to quarantine - they can be in school with a mask on and monitoring their symptoms.

A person who is not vaccinated

- --They are sent home whether they have symptoms or not
- --They can be tested 5-7 days after the last contact that they have had with the positive case. If they test negative and don't have symptoms, they can come back to school with that negative test and mask until the 10 day mark.
- --If they do not get tested, they must quarantine the full 10 days and can only come back if they don't have symptoms. They monitor for four more days for symptoms.

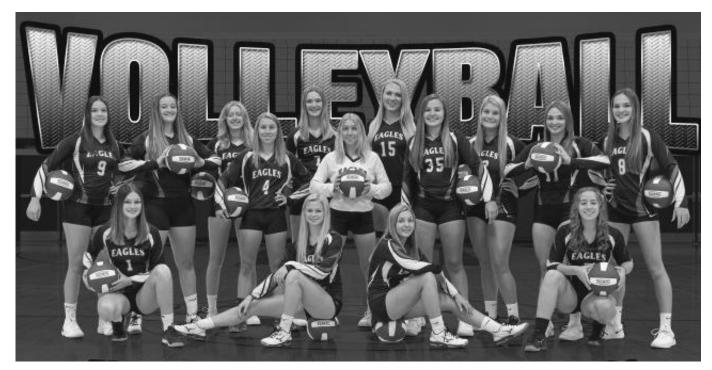

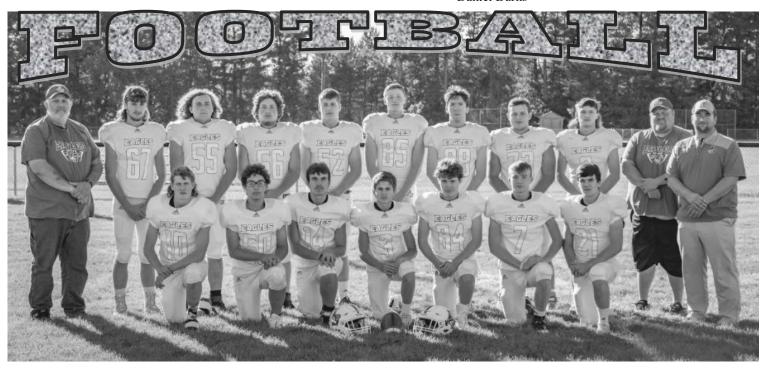
