4K Registration 2023-2024

The Almond-Bancroft School District will be sending out letters soon to all district families that have a student eligible for Pre-Kindergarten (4K) during the 2023-2024 school year. If you or someone you know has a child who will be 4 before September 1, 2023, they are eligible! However, they will need to have registered their child on the school's census in

order to be on the mailing list. In addition, the School District will also be sending out Preschool Questionnaires to all district children that are between the ages of 30-40 months. The questionnaire that is enclosed will be specific to his/her age range. Families need to have registered their child on the school's census to receive a packet. Not all children of this age are on our census.

How do we get added to the census?

If you, <u>or someone you know</u>, have young children not on the census, please call/have them call Sandy Barden at 715-366-2941 x108 and provide her with the child's name, birthdate, and address. Please note: children can be added to the school census at any age – they do not need to be 30 months!

The students had an amazing time learning about constellations and our solar system. One of our students even found his great-grandpa's name on the wall at the Korean War Memorial!











3rd Grade created life size LEGO SELFIES in art class!

HS Ag classes spent a morning outside with guests, Ken Schroeder from UW-Extension, Dan O'Connell from the Portage County Land and Water Conservation Department, and local farmer, John Ruzicka. Students learned hands-on about soil texture, sampling, moisture-holding capability, water infiltration, and the importance of cover cropping for soil health.



8th grade Agriculture students prepped the courtyard gardens for winter. Students learned how to save annual flower seeds, identify weeds, and calculate the volume of water in the pond. They also raked the leaves and spread milkweed seeds to help the endangered pollinator butterfly, the Monarch.
