4K Registration 2023-2024

The Almond-Bancroft School District will be sending out letters soon to all district families that have a student eligible for Pre-Kindergarten (4K) during the 2023-2024 school year. If you or someone you know has a child who will be 4 before September 1, 2023, they are eligible! However, they will need to have registered their child on the school's census in

order to be on the mailing list.

In addition, the School District will also be sending out Preschool Questionnaires to all district children that are between the ages of 30-40 months. The questionnaire that is enclosed will be specific to his/her age range. Families need to have registered their child on the school's census to receive a packet. Not all children of this age are on our census.

How do we get added to the census?

If you, or someone you know, have young children not on the census, please call/have them call Sandy Barden at 715-366-2941 x108 and provide her with the child's name, birthdate, and address. Please note: children can be added to the school census at any age – they do not need to be 30 months!

Recess was snow much fun with the first real snowfall of the season!








We love to see middle school students reading! The 6th graders are really enjoying their books in ELA.

High School Fall Athletics and Awards Banquet


A-B high school football and volleyball athletes were recognized at the fall athletics banquet.






