Notes from the District Administrator

As I'm sitting at home working on this article the snow is coming down, the wind is blowing and the temperature is dropping. However, I am forever an optimist and I know that March is the beginning of spring, warmer air, the awakening of the beauty that is Wisconsin. There are a lot of great things going

on in Almond-Bancroft Schools and more great things to come.

- On average, 40% of our students have already reached their annual typical growth goal and 15% have met their annual stretch goal in our iReady reading assessment and it's only the middle of the year. On average, 34% of our students have already reached their annual typical growth goal and 8% have met their annual stretch goal in our iReady math assessment.
- The last week of February we celebrated Read Across America with several activities organized by our Title 1 teacher and interventionist at the elementary school. Activities included a reading challenge for students, guest readers in classes, and a read-in for all schools!
- Our new Science Olympiad team is having amazing success! They recently competed in their regional competition with much larger schools and earned 7 gold, 4 silver and 1 fourth place medal! See their picture later in this newsletter!
- We have brought back our agriculture program to A-B Schools! Our teacher Ms. Mocker and her students had a goal to bring back FFA as well, and they have succeeded. They celebrated National FFA week in February and are finalizing their first fundraiser. We are proud of everyone for making this happen!
- Our band and choir students participated in the District Solo and Ensemble competition.
- Our high school basketball teams are winding down their season. Both teams have been doing very well this year.

In March

- This is the start of our state testing season. The ACT test for juniors is March 7. The Wisconsin Forward and PreACT Secure testing windows also begin in March. We know that students don't always like state testing, but we are excited to see the students' learning and growth in these results. We ask that you join with us in encouraging your students to try their best on these tests.
- March 14 is Pi day, and as our students are learning their math concepts, they will also be participating in challenges to celebrate this day.
- Third quarter ends on March 17. It's hard to believe that the year is getting closer to being done.
- Softball, baseball, and track seasons are beginning.
- Spring break begins March 20th.

As we move into March I am excited to see what the spring will bring. It's hard when the snow is flying to remember that warm weather is coming and the world will be green again. As an eternal optimist, I keep my eyes on the sun and the future of Almond-Bancroft School District. I am proud of what the staff and students are already doing and can't wait to see what we can accomplish together as we move forward.

MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS OF THE MONTH


Each month middle school staff members choose one student from each grade level that has demonstrated positive behavior throughout the month. Here are the winners and comments from January.





Reopening of the Almond-Bancroft FFA Chapter


