

Field Trips: UW-Marathon County and UW-Stevens Point



A chance to visit UW-Marathon County is coming up! In October, interested juniors and seniors will travel to UW-Marathon County (UW-MC) in Wausau to learn more about this 2-year UW-College. UW-MC is a school of access to the 4-year University system. Students spend two years completing their general program of study (courses in English, history, science, and math) at UW-MC before they head off to a 4-year WI University to complete their bachelor degree in the major of their choice.

UW-Marathon County offers a guaranteed transfer option to any of the 4-year schools in the UW system.

On November 3, Juniors and Seniors will have the opportunity to travel to the University of

Wisconsin–Stevens Point to visit the campus. They will learn about the admissions process, financial aid, student life, and career services. They will also go on a campus tour, which includes a mini-session on housing and an in-depth look at a residence hall. This would be a great chance for students to visit a 4-year UW campus.

A sign-up announcement will be made prior to the both events.

PSAT for Juniors

Juniors have the opportunity to sign up for the PSAT, which will take place on October 11th. The most common reasons for taking the PSAT/NMSQT are to:

- Receive feedback on your strengths and weaknesses on skills necessary for college study.
- See how your performance on an admissions test might compare with that of others applying to college.
- Enter the competition for scholarships from National Merit Scholarship Program.
- ◆ Help prepare for the ACT/SAT. You can become familiar with the kinds of questions you will see on the ACT/SAT.
- Receive information from colleges when you check "yes" to Student Search Service.

Apple Pecan Rosemary Greek Yogurt Chicken Salad

Ingredients

Salad

1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts, cooked, cooled, and diced into small cubes

1 1/4 cups chopped golden delicious, gala or fuji apple (chop small)

1/3 cup chopped pecans

1/3 cup dried cranberries, roughly chopped

Dressing

1 (5.3 oz.) container fat-free plain greek yogurt (heaping 1/2 cup)

2 Tbsp. mayonnaise

1 Tbsp. red wine vinegar

2 1/2 tsp finely chopped rosemary

1 tsp dijon mustard

1/2 tsp honey

1/2 tsp onion powder

Salt and freshly ground black pepper

Romaine Lettuce or whole grain bread, for serving

Instructions

Add chicken, apples, pecans, and cranberries to a large mixing bowl. In a separate small mixing bowl mix together greek yogurt, mayonnaise, red wine vinegar, rosemary, mustard, honey and onion powder. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Pour over chicken mixture then toss to evenly coat.

2017-18 YEARBOOK – SENIOR PHOTO LETTER CLASS OF 2018-Senior Photo Submission Deadline: <u>Friday, December 1, 2017</u>

Dear Parents and Members of the Class of 2018,

Congratulations on your successes! The following information will help you plan for your senior portraits and ensure that the photo in your child's yearbook will be treasured. You may submit a photo taken by a professional photographer of your choice, as long as your submitted photo meets deadline, aesthetic and technical specifications. If you have not yet scheduled a sitting with a professional photographer, do so as soon as possible. Yes, I know it seems early to make these plans, but it's not!

The purpose of the senior photo policy is to promote clarity and recognition of students and to discourage controversial submissions.

- The photo must be a head and shoulders shot of the student (from the waist up is acceptable). No profiles please (both eyes of the senior should be visible).
- The photo should be submitted without any writing on it (i.e., the name of the photographer's studio, student's name, Class of 2018, etc.).
- The staff designs the book for portrait pictures only (landscape photos will be cropped).
- The photo must not have an all-white or all-black background as these photos often look like "cut-outs"
- The photo must not contain props, pets, or persons other than the senior (props include vehicles, sports equipment, animals, instruments, etc.)
- Students in the photo must follow the school dress code. Although it is usually summer when photos are taken, students must have their bodies adequately covered. No cleavage. No hats. No inappropriate logos on t-shirts.

Due to copyright laws, your photographer must submit a senior portrait to the yearbook staff and grant his/her permission for the yearbook staff to publish the photograph. The best way to do this is to have the photographer send an e-mail to Mrs. Rykal which releases the photograph for publication in the Almond-Bancroft Yearbook with the photo attached. Photographers should note that these photos are also used for the senior video at the graduation ceremony and submitted to the Waushara Argus Paper and the Stevens Point Journal.

If you will not be using a professional photographer to take your senior's photo(s), the student may ask a yearbook staff member to take a quality photograph of him/her in a local indoor or outdoor setting. You may also submit an unprofessional photo as long as the picture is well focused and has a high resolution and meets the above listed criteria.

Enjoy the upcoming, fast-paced year with your senior! Thank you for your cooperation and feel free to contact Mrs. Rykal with any questions.



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

The Bancroft School is for sale.

The Almond-Bancroft School District is entertaining offers from interested parties to purchase the school located on School Road in Bancroft. The approximate 9,000 square foot building sits on an estimated five (5) acre site, and most recently housed the District's pre-K and kindergarten classes. Due to recent declines in district enrollment, the school in Almond has enough room to accommodate all of the District's 399 students.

The process to close the school began last year with the results of an advisory referendum that residents voted 817 – 454 in support of closing the school. The Almond-Bancroft School Board then voted in January to relocate the classes being held in Bancroft to the school in Almond beginning in the 2017-2018 school year. This move will result in an increase of the amount of instructional time students receive, a reduction in the time the young students spend on a school bus, and reduced operational expenses.

The district is currently obtaining an appraisal for the building and property located just north of Highway W in the town of Pine Grove.
