Reading Nook

Grab a Book and Read

Our goal as families and teachers is to help our children and students become better readers. The best start for them to do this, is practice reading books that are a good-fit. This means they need to be choosing books that they can read the words, comprehend, and are interested in. We use the I PICK method in the reading room.



I choose a book. Purpose: Why do I want to read this book? Interest: Does it interest me? Comprehend: Do I understand what I am reading? Know: Do I know most of the words?

Children can use this method at home, the local library, or in the classroom. If you are interested in a poster to keep with your family, let me know, and I'll send you one. If a student is very interested in a book that is not a good-fit because it's too difficult. This can be a great book to listen to, which we will dive into next month.

Another place to find good-fit books is through book orders, bookstores, or book fairs. Our annual Almond-Bancroft Book Fair is quickly approaching. The Book Fair will be arriving in early November, and will be open for business during both Parent-Teacher Conference Nights.

 Cinnamon Toast Pumpkin Seeds

 Ingredients

 3 tablespoons butter, melted

 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

 1/4 teaspoon salt

 1 1/2 cups pumpkin seeds

 2 tablespoons white sugar

 Directions

 1. Preheat oven to 300 degrees F (150 degrees C).

 2. Mix butter, cinnamon, and salt together in a bowl.

 3. Place pumpkin seeds in a large bowl and pour butter mixture over seeds; toss to evenly coat. Spread coated seeds in a single layer onto a baking sheet.

 Bake in the preheated oven, stirring occasionally, until seeds are lightly browned, about 40 minutes. Remove baking sheet from oven; sprinkle sugar over seeds and stir until evenly coated.

Helping Through Harvey

The Almond-Bancroft National Honor Society is organizing a community fundraiser to support students and families in Texas that have been effected by Hurricane Harvey.

Our school community will be "adopting" the **Texas School for the Deaf (TSD)**, which is located in Austin, TX. Texas School for the Deaf provides education and services to students ages 0-21 who are deaf or hard of hearing and who may have multiple disabilities. Students live on campus in dorms and much of the school funding comes from gifts and federal grants.

Texas School for the Deaf asks that we keep TSD families in our hearts and prayers for the coming weeks and months ahead, as their needs for shelter, food, and comfort will be enormous and for many, long-term. To date, most of their Houston area students have been displaced by the flooding and have not yet returned to school.

Through local donations, TSD has received many school supplies and some items of clothing. With the number of students and families that have lost everything, TSD is requesting a monetary donation, which will allow 100% of funding to go directly to the students and families that still need basic living items. TSD Staff will take the students shopping to get necessary clothing and personal items. This monetary donation allows us to ensure that these students and families receive exactly what they need.

We will also be asking our elementary students to help us by creating cards for us to send to Texas School for the Deaf students. We love seeing our students supporting others, and can't wait to show TSD our caring community spirit!

2017-18 YEARBOOK – SENIOR PHOTO LETTER CLASS OF 2018-Senior Photo Submission Deadline: <u>Friday, December 1, 2017</u>

Dear Parents and Members of the Class of 2018,

Congratulations on your successes! The following information will help you plan for your senior portraits and ensure that the photo in your child's yearbook will be treasured. You may submit a photo taken by a professional photographer of your choice, as long as your submitted photo meets deadline, aesthetic and technical specifications. If you have not yet scheduled a sitting with a professional photographer, do so as soon as possible. Yes, I know it seems early to make these plans, but it's not!

The purpose of the senior photo policy is to promote clarity and recognition of students and to discourage controversial submissions.

- The photo must be a head and shoulders shot of the student (from the waist up is acceptable). No profiles please (both eyes of the senior should be visible).
- The photo should be submitted without any writing on it (i.e., the name of the photographer's studio, student's name, Class of 2018, etc.).
- The staff designs the book for portrait pictures only (landscape photos will be cropped).
- The photo must not have an all-white or all-black background as these photos often look like "cut-outs"
- The photo must not contain props, pets, or persons other than the senior (props include vehicles, sports equipment, animals, instruments, etc.)
- Students in the photo must follow the school dress code. Although it is usually summer when photos are taken, students must have their bodies adequately covered. No cleavage. No hats. No inappropriate logos on t-shirts.

Due to copyright laws, your photographer must submit a senior portrait to the yearbook staff and grant his/ her permission for the yearbook staff to publish the photograph. The best way to do this is to have the photographer send an e-mail to Mrs. Rykal which releases the photograph for publication in the Almond-Bancroft Yearbook with the photo attached. <u>Photographers should note that these photos are also used for</u> the senior video at the graduation ceremony and submitted to the Waushara Argus Paper and the Stevens Point Journal.

If you will not be using a professional photographer to take your senior's photo(s), the student may ask a yearbook staff member to take a quality photograph of him/her in a local indoor or outdoor setting. You may also submit an unprofessional photo as long as the picture is well focused and has a high resolution and meets the above listed criteria.

Enjoy the upcoming, fast-paced year with your senior! Thank you for your cooperation and feel free to contact Mrs. Rykal with any questions.
