Educating the Whole Child By: Jeff Rykal, PreK-12 Principal

Educating our children can be a very complex task at times. Our world is changing at an ever increasing pace, which places additional stresses on all our lives. That stress is brought to school by our students, as well as staff, on a daily basis. We must be cognizant of our abilities

and strategies for shedding this stress so that we can focus on guiding our students towards being fine young adults before they head off into the world. For our society to be successful at this most important task, we need to

Maslow's hierarchy of needs (1943)

What do we mean by the whole child? There is much that we must take in consideration to make sure that students are ready to learn. Maslow's hierarchy of needs, pictured to the left, is one of the best summaries of what schools need to address on a daily basis.

Basic needs must be addressed on a daily basis. A hungry child has difficulty focusing. The school breakfast and lunch program is necessary to make sure this need is met. Our building atmosphere must be comfortable, inviting, and a place where students, teachers, and community members feel safe.

Once basic needs are met we can focus on the social and emotional needs of our students. Friendships and a sense of belonging are so very important for every child. The children of Al-

mond-Bancroft often hear me refer to **our school community as a family**. Just like at your Thanksgiving dinner, if family members get into an argument, harm is done, and it must be repaired/mended. Almond-Bancroft is a family and we focus on maintaining positive relationships with all family members. Can we be dysfunctional at times? Sure - what family isn't? When that happens, we do our very best to mend the relationships. When students don't feel that they belong and are cared about, they struggle to find their self-worth, and we see a downslide in their ability to be successful in the classroom.

Ultimately, as educators and parents, we want to see our students become self-actualized, creating their own personal goals for growth. We want them ready to leave the nest and take on the world. Does every child make it there before graduation - not necessarily. We all know (or were) that kid that lives in Mom and Dad's basement until they find their path in life.

Academic achievement is vitally important, however it is only a small part of what makes up teaching and learning. When we forget to consider the basic needs and/or the social/emotional needs of the children we work

Senior Photo Submission Deadline: Friday, December 6th 2019

Congratulations on your successes! The following information will help you plan for your senior portraits and ensure that the photo in your child's yearbook will be treasured. You may submit a photo taken by a professional photographer of your choice, as long as your submitted photo meets deadline, aesthetic and technical specifications. It isn't too soon to schedule your senior portrait sitting with your favorite photographer.

The purpose of the senior photo policy is to promote clarity and recognition of students and to discourage controversial submissions.

The photo must be a head and shoulders shot of the student (from the waist up is acceptable). No profiles please (both eyes of the senior should be visible).

The photo should be submitted without any writing on it (the name of the photographer's studio, etc.).

The staff designs the book for portrait pictures only (landscape photos will be cropped).

The photo must not have an all-white or all-black background, as these photos often look like "cut-outs"

The photo must not contain props, pets, or persons other than the senior (props include vehicles, sports equipment, instruments, etc.). Pictures taken in a natural environment look best.

Students in the photo must follow the school dress code. Although it is usually Summer when photos are taken, students must have their bodies adequately covered. No cleavage. No hats. No inappropriate logos on t-

Due to copyright laws, your photographer must submit a senior portrait to the yearbook staff and grant his/her permission for the yearbook staff to publish the photograph. The best way to do this is to have the photographer send an e-mail to Mrs. Rykal which releases the photograph for publication in the Almond-Bancroft Yearbook with the photo attached. Photographers should note that these photos are also used for the senior video at the graduation ceremony and submitted to the Waushara Argus Paper and the Stevens Point Journal.

If you will not be using a professional photographer to take your senior's photo, the student may ask Mrs. Rykal to take a quality photograph of him/her in a local indoor or outdoor setting. You may also submit an unprofessional photo as long as the picture is well focused and has a high resolution. If no picture is submitted, the school photo

Youth Wrestling


Once again, I will be offering Youth Wrestling for K-5th grades. Practices will start Monday, January 6th at 5:15 PM in the school cafeteria. For any wrestler that may be considering wrestling at earlier tournaments, (Westfield, Sunday, December 29th and Mosinee, Sunday, January 5th) I will offer practices starting Monday, December 9th at 5:15 PM. A complete schedule will be handed out on the first day of each of the practices. Practices generally run Monday and Tuesdays from 5:15-6:30 PM and Thursday practices will be offered prior to scheduled weekend tournaments.

In the past, I've noticed that the more adults we have working with kids during practice, the easier it is for them to learn and stay focused. With that being said, I ask that all Kindergarten and 1st grade wrestlers have a family member available at practices. Any additional help families are willing and able to provide would be greatly appreciated.

New for this year, we have actual team uniforms. I currently have wrestling warm up shorts and singlets and will be ordering hooded warm -up tops. Uniforms will be handed out on Thursdays prior to tournaments and are requested to be returned the following week. I ask that parents consider buying wrestling shoes and headgear for your wrestler but neither are required for competition.
