
#### <u>Almond-Bancroft</u> <u>School District</u> <u>Mission Statement</u>

### ALMOND-BANCROFT 2012 VALEDICTORIN AND ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

Jon Pagel has been selected to receive the 2012 Academic Excellence Scholarship by earning the spot of valedictorian of the 2012 graduating class.

Academic Excellence Scholarships, established in 1989 by the state Legislature, are awarded to Wisconsin high school seniors who have the highest grade point average in each public and private high school throughout the State of Wisconsin. The number of scholarships each high school is eligible to give out is based on total student enrollment. Almond-Bancroft, with a high school enrollment below 500, is able to award one senior this scholarship. In order to receive a scholarship, a student must be enrolled on a full-time basis at a participating University of Wisconsin, Wisconsin Technical College, or independent institution in the state by September 30th of the academic year following their graduation. The



value of the scholarship is \$2,250 per year for four years and is to be applied towards tuition. Half of the scholarship is funded by the state, while the institution matches the other half.

Jon has been an all-around athlete and student all four years of his high school career. He was in football and basketball his freshmen through senior years and he was in track his junior and senior years. He received many honors as a football player, including two 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Conference positions, one 1<sup>st</sup> Team All-Region position, Conference Offensive Player of the Year, Honorable Mention All-State Running Back, and Most Valuable Player Award. He also broke three school records in football and one in basketball during high school. Jon was a member of the National Honor Society, Quiz Bowl, and Math League. During Jon's sophomore year, he was selected to attend the Wisconsin Leadership Seminar, which is a weekend long event that recognizes positive students throughout the state. Jon plans to attend UW-Platteville this fall and complete their civil engineering program. He has always excelled in math and science courses and is looking forward to the challenge of earning his degree.

### ALMOND-BANCROFT 2012 SALUTATORIAN

Jeanette Colombe has earned the position of salutatorian for the 2012 graduating class. Jeanette has always been an outstanding student who puts forth her best effort in everything she does. She has been involved in many clubs throughout high school, including National Honor Society, Spanish Club, Quiz Bowl, ACES, Mock Trial, Solo/Ensemble, and Band. 


### High School Student Of The Week March 12 - March 15
