





School Counseling Program K-5 "By All For All" By Dawn Barber

Welcome back to the start of another busy school year! I wanted to write a note about our K-5 school counseling program for our new families and those who may not be familiar with it. Our school counseling program is *FOR ALL*, meaning that 100% of our K-5 students participate in the program. There are four program components including:

<u>School Counseling Curriculum</u>- This is the one you are most likely to hear about. Your children may talk about our G.I.F.T.S. program. Part of this program includes classroom time with the counselor. This year when we are together, we will focus on the following concepts: **Honesty, Self-Discipline and Forgiveness**. Our entire staff works together with parents and community members to promote these important concepts. We even send home green postcards that recognize students who have exhibited model behavior so that families can continue to reinforce our concepts at home; *BY ALL!*

Individual Student Planning- This component includes academic support, goal setting and transition services.

<u>Responsive Services</u>- This component includes individual and group counseling, crisis counseling, conflict resolution and parent contacts and referrals. Your child can receive counseling services by self/parent/teacher request. He/she may also be invited to be part of a small group during the school year, which focuses on a specific topic such as peer relationships or family change.

<u>System Support</u>- This is the last component of a comprehensive school counseling program and it includes consultation and collaboration with building staff, professional development, and program management and evaluation. Students/Parents of Sophomores:

Last year was the first year I required all the sophomore students to take the PLAN test. This test is an ACT preparation test, which is a predictor of success on the ACT, an early indicator of college readiness, and a tool to help students explore careers that match their interest. The testing process went well last year, and the students found their results helpful. Due to this, all 10th grade students will again be taking PLAN on October 7th this year during hours 1-4. AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING PROGRAM

The after school tutoring program at the Almond-Bancroft School District is set to begin Monday, September 22nd. Mondays and Wednesdays have been set aside for middle school students designated by their teachers to receive extra help in their studies. Tuesdays and Thursdays are also open for students, middle school or otherwise, seeking academic assistance. Please encourage your child to attend. The tutoring program is designed to help students regardless of any special needs, plus promoting better study habits. The program is in session from 3:30 in the afternoon to 5 p.m. The following is a schedule for busing, snacks, etc:

Mondays/Wednesdays - Middle school students only: 3:30 to 5 p.m. A bus is available to transport the students home. Additionally, around 4 o'clock the students recharge their batteries with a fifteen minute break and snacks served by the school cafeteria.

Tuesdays/Thursdays - Open: 3:30 to 5 pm. A break and snacks are available, however, on these days parents must make their own arrangements to transport their child.
