Notes from the District Administrator

Dear Families and Community Members:

Our district is immersed in opportunities for academic growth. Our middle school and high school both have implemented new math curriculum, our middle school is engaged in a research project implementing an intensive literacy intervention program called Read 180U, and our elementary teachers are focused on incorporating best practices in literacy instruction. As we move

forward with our academic goals, we also recognize the need for mindfulness in ourselves and in our interactions with others as a base for developing strong relationships that will in turn create an environment conducive for higher academic achievement among our students.

Mindfulness is being focused on your feelings and surroundings in the moment without judgement, and recognizing how we react to situations and interact with each other can either be positive or negative. Research reveals students learn better in a climate that is emotionally positive. Studies have demonstrated emotionally positive classrooms foster higher student achievement. Spending too much time daydreaming or thinking negative thoughts can be draining and lead to stress, anxiety, and symptoms of depression. Practicing mindfulness can direct attention away from negative thinking and actions toward positive thinking and actions.

When staff members practice mindfulness, they reap numerous benefits including lower stress levels, greater efficacy in their jobs, more emotionally supportive school environments, and better organization. Students practicing mindfulness have improved cognitive outcomes, positive social-emotional skills, and higher levels of overall wellness. Students also show more attention and focus in learning, improved emotional self-regulation, empathy and perspective taking, greater compassion, and improved engagement in the classroom and in social situations.

Start practicing mindfulness. Take a walk outside and be aware of the surroundings. Breathe in the fresh air while finding 5 things to see, 4 things to hear, 3 things to touch, 2 things to smell and 1 thing to taste. Also use positive words. Words impact your thoughts, thoughts impact your behaviors and behaviors impact your destiny. Instead of problems, use challenges. Challenges are situations we can conquer by taking positive action. Instead of worrying, use focus. What do you focus on to get to a desired outcome? Instead of using the words such as be careful, which can sound like being on defense, use the words be aware or be alert, which sound like you are on offense.

Join us in our journey toward decreased stress, increased awareness, and improved relationships. Be mindful every day until it becomes effortless.

How can we as parents help our children find that light? As a parent of four, I too struggle with this at times...how do I help nudge them towards finding success in their lives without pushing too hard? The secret to this, I've found, is recognizing that each child is an individual who will each create their own version of happiness. As a parent, I need to be able to understand that their idea of happiness and mine may not be the same...two visions colliding with one another. As parents, what truly matters is how we deal with those collisions.

If I try to push them towards my own vision, generally I get push back. Instead, what our children really need is encouragement and life experiences that help them create their own vision of their future. This encouragement can be as simple as a dinner time discussion about what they want to be when they grow up (for our younger children) or what careers have they thought about pursuing (seniors about to leave the nest). Encourage your children to get involved in activities and organizations that will provide them experiences that shape their passion and zest for life. When you see that spark in their eye, encourage them to go further with their research and engagement in whatever area they are excited about.

It's also important to note that our children's passions can change on a dime, and as parents, we have to be accepting of this and able to shift our encouragement to their new found loves. Most importantly, when our children have times of darkness, we need to be the light, using our own experiences and knowledge gained in our lifetime to guide them through the rough waters...be the light.

Reading At Home

Reading at home is just as important as reading at school. Here are a few ideas on how to support your reader(s) at home:

-Set a goal for your student to read with you or independently for at least 20 minutes a day. -Help him/her find books at home and at your local library.

-Make connections between your child's interests and books to read. For example, if he/she likes animals, try to locate books on animals, both fiction and nonfiction.

-Try to spend time every day with your reader looking through "nonbook" reading materials, such as websites, pieces of mail, advertisements, and food labels, to demonstrate how important a part reading plays in daily life.

-Consider sharing with your child the kinds of things you are reading. Tell about interesting things you read in the newspaper, or about a magazine article that taught you something new.

Elementary Classroom Guidance

We are continuing our focus on *identity* and *self-awareness* in classroom guidance activities. Our lessons involve exploring our own thoughts, feelings, and behaviors as they all impact who we are as a person. We use the "Zones of Regulation" to expand our knowledge of our feelings and the strategies we can use to return to a calm, "ready to learn" state when we need them. Students are expanding their emotional vocabulary which is an integral piece in expressing oneself and maintaining good mental health.



Academic & Career Planning

Our grade 6-12 students all use a software program called **Xello** as part of their Academic & Career Planning. Xello is a brand new program that helps students plan their own journey, whether it involves a trade, college, university, entrepreneurship, or other training. In Xello, students have opportunities to take inventories that match their interests with careers, explore various colleges and technical schools, research job trends and salaries, and more. Wisconsin provided this software to districts at no charge when middle and high school academic and career planning became mandated in our state. Middle school students use Xello as part of their careers class with Mrs. Rykal, while high school students are guided by their homeroom teachers to complete tasks two times per month. It is a very nice tool for career exploration and planning, and students are able to login at home which is great for families who wish to have discussions about post high school planning with their children. Ask your student to show you his/her Xello page at www.xello.world.



Seventeen juniors and seniors attended last months' educational fair at Mid-State. Over sixty college, university, and military representatives were on hand to share information about everything from academic programs, applications, tuition, housing, and extra-curricular activities.

Parents of College Bound Seniors:

Currently, I am meeting one on one with all seniors on graduation credit checks and to begin post-high school planning.

- There are many opportunities for students to meet with representatives from both four-year and two-year colleges here at school. These are perfect times to get specific information about academic programs, financial aid, housing, and extra-curricular activities.
- College applications are open now and they each have different deadlines. I would encourage you to visit the individual college websites for that information. If your son or daughter does not know what school they would like to attend, please consider visiting several schools on their college visitation days.
- The bulk of scholarship opportunities will become available after the new year. Now is the time for your students to think about who they will ask for letters of recommendation.
- Applications for Federal Student Aid are open.

SENIOR PORTRAITS FOR THE YEARBOOK

To: Parents and Members of the Class of 2020 Senior Photo Submission Deadline: <u>Friday, December 6th 2019</u>

Congratulations on your successes! The following information will help you plan for your senior portraits and ensure that the photo in your child's yearbook will be treasured. You may submit a photo taken by a professional photographer of your choice, as long as your submitted photo meets deadline, aesthetic and technical specifications. It isn't too soon to schedule your senior portrait sitting with your favorite photographer. The purpose of the senior photo policy is to promote clarity and recognition of students and to discourage

The purpose of the senior photo policy is to promote clarity and recognition of students and to discourage controversial submissions.

- The photo must be a head and shoulders shot of the student (from the waist up is acceptable). No profiles please (both eyes of the senior should be visible).
- The photo should be submitted without any writing on it (the name of the photographer's studio, etc.).
- The staff designs the book for portrait pictures only (landscape photos will be cropped).

The photo must not have an all-white or all-black background, as these photos often look like "cut-outs"

- The photo must not contain props, pets, or persons other than the senior (props include vehicles, sports equipment, instruments, etc.). Pictures taken in a natural environment look best.
- Students in the photo must follow the school dress code. Although it is usually Summer when photos are taken, students must have their bodies adequately covered. No cleavage. No hats. No inappropriate logos on t-shirts.

Due to copyright laws, your photographer must submit a senior portrait to the yearbook staff and grant his/her permission for the yearbook staff to publish the photograph. The best way to do this is to have the photographer send an e-mail to Mrs. Rykal which releases the photograph for publication in the Almond-Bancroft Yearbook with the photo attached. Photographers should note that these photos are also used for the senior video at the graduation ceremony and submitted to the Waushara Argus Paper and the Stevens Point Journal.

If you will not be using a professional photographer to take your senior's photo, the student may ask Mrs. Rykal to take a quality photograph of him/her in a local indoor or outdoor setting. You may also submit an unprofessional photo as long as the picture is well focused and has a high resolution. If no picture is submitted, the school photo will be utilized.

Immunization Program

October 28, 2019

Dear Parents/Guardians:

The Portage County Division of Public Health is working with your child's school to give the annual influenza vaccine to children at school. This vaccine will protect against all four influenza strains that are expected to circulate this year. This is a <u>FREE voluntary vaccination</u>. We will hold vaccination clinics beginning in November.

Attached you will find the following:

- 1) Parental consent form that will allow your child to be vaccinated against the flu at school.
- 2) Information regarding the influenza vaccine.

If you would like your child to be vaccinated, please read the attached forms. The only form that MUST be returned to your child's school is the Parent Consent Form filled out completely. This form should be returned to the school nurse within one week of the vaccination clinic. Date of Clinic November 11th from 1pm till 3 pm. Deadline for forms will be Wednesday November 6th.

If the form is not received by Wednesday November 6th, your child will NOT be vaccinated. There will be no exceptions.

• Note: Depending on whether they've gotten influenza vaccines in the past, some children younger than nine years of age will need two doses of vaccine spaced about 4 weeks apart. If your child falls into this category you will receive further information from Public health after the clinic.

If you have any questions about the vaccine or the vaccination clinics, please call: 715-345-5350 Option 8 to speak with a public health nurse, Monday – Friday 8 AM to 4:30 PM.
