Notes from the District Administrator

Winter in Wisconsin can bring all sorts of weather from extreme cold, blowing snow, mild sunny days, or even freezing rain. For me, the best part about being in the midst of winter is thinking about summer school. I also enjoy this time of year as it is when we start to plan for next year, which is always refreshing and invigorating. We are committed to providing excellent opportunities for our students to learn

and grow, so we are excited to present information on some possible changes to our 4-year -old kindergarten program and also to present our summer school.

We are requesting input from parents and community members as we consider a new delivery model for our 4-year-old kindergarten (4K) program. As part of our commitment to excellence in education for our children, we are seeking to develop a program that will provide more consistency in learning. Currently, our 4K students attend school two full days each week. This leaves gaps in learning time; therefore time is being used to review and re-learn material rather than to expand and enrich learning. We propose offering 4K programming four days each week in ½ day sessions in conjunction with an option for parents to enroll their children in an Extended Learning Center right here in school the other half of the day creating an all-day experience. Please read the information about our proposal in this newsletter and send us your feedback. We would love to hear from you.

Summer school is creeping up on us. In order to be prepared, we must start the planning process. Our purpose for offering summer school is to provide our students with opportunities to "play to learn" through engagement, enrichment, and exploration. All students attending summer school will participate in a variety of activities incorporating recreation, sports, culture, the fine arts, literature, and STEM (science, technology, engineering and math). There will also be other fun activities based on the natural curiosity students have to learn about the world around them. They will inquire, discover, experiment, create, build, and achieve. Watch for registration and join us for the fun!

Common Denominator Jeff Rykal PreK-12 Principal



Almond-Bancroft School District Pre-Kindergarten Programming Survey

In order to increase academic consistency for our Pre-Kindergarten students, the Almond-Bancroft School District is currently looking into changing the Pre-Kindergarten program. However, we are seeking parental and community input before any decisions are made. Please take a few moments to read through the proposed changes below and answer the survey questions on the attached sheet. Feel free to share this proposal with other community members and add their comments as well. If you need additional copies of this survey, please call Penny Boileau at (715) 366-2941 ext. 418. The survey is also offered online, and you can find the link on the School District's website. The survey is being kept anonymous in order to promote honest feedback and your opinion is greatly appreciated. If you, or another community member, do not have a Pre-Kindergarten student, please answer the questions as if you did. We are asking that surveys be completed and returned/submitted by Friday, February 14th in order to review these surveys and present the information at the February School Board Meeting.

<u>CURRENT PROGRAMMING – 2 Full Days</u>: Currently, the Pre-Kindergarten program is run two full days a week. One group of students attends on Mondays and Wednesdays while the other group attends on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Bussing is offered to all students for both morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off. Fridays are non-student days.

<u>PROPOSED PROGRAMMING – 4 Half Days</u>: Students would attend Monday **through** Thursday, with one group attending in the mornings and one group attending in the afternoons (exact times to be determined). Bussing would continue to be offered to all students for both morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off; however, **mid-day bussing would NOT be offered**. Parents would either have the option to pick-up/drop-off their child at that mid-day transition time OR take advantage of an Extended Learning Center (ELC), free of charge, housed within the school building. If using the ELC option, Pre-Kindergarten students would be in the building the same times as K-12 students, but their time would be split between the Pre-Kindergarten Classroom and an Extended Learning Center. Furthermore, bussing would be available to them for the morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off times, with the other students. Fridays would continue to be a non-student day (meaning the ELC would not be available).

*With this change in programming, students would CONTINUE to follow the District calendar; they would not attend class or ELC on "No School" days. Additionally, there would be no class or ELC during breaks, including summer.

*The District's goal would be to offer the ELC at no cost to resident families. However, there would continue to be a cost for meals if students eat breakfast, lunch, and snack each day. The meals would be provided through the School Meal Program.

**More specific details of the Extended Learning Center will be developed if the Pre-Kindergarten programming changes take place. The AB School District will inform families of those details.

Reading Nook

Time for a Story



Want to spend time with your youngster, build her reading skills, and help her learn to love books? You can do all three when you read aloud. Here are suggestions.

Read Regularly

Try to read to your child every day. You might aim for 10-15 minutes of bedtime reading for a peaceful end to the day. Bring along a book, and read to her during a sibling's sports practice. Or curl up together with a book when you get home from work.

Take Turns Choosing Books

Your youngster may want to hear old favorites again and again. Use your turn for new titles and variety, such as nonfiction or poetry.

Let Her Participate

Ask your child to turn the pages while you read. Also, she can finish sentences that rhyme or fill in words she knows. Go slowly so she has time to understand the story and look at the illustrations. She'll enjoy read-aloud time more if she plays an active role.

Be Playful

You can use different voices for different characters (a high, squeaky voice for a mouse or a deep, booming voice for a horse). Or substitute your youngster's name for the main character's name, and use family members' names for other characters.

NOTE: You do not have to be an expert reader-your child will love it when you read aloud because it's you.




